

Where	How to find it	Notes
Blake End	South of Great Saling, just off A120	No scones!!! But plenty of other nice cakes. Date slice highly recommended. Sadly not waitress service though. Order at counter on entry
Coggeshall Clocktower Teashop,	Opposite Baumanns Restaurant	Best scones ever. One alone is a meal, and is only £1. And you can buy to take home. Fit panniers! Cons – outside seating is completely in the shade, and inside has the hushed tones of a library. Only open weekends.
Coggeshall	Opp White Hart	More café like than teashop, have to order at counter. But lovely food, good value. Chocolate coated flapjacks the bargain buy. Scones also very good
Stisted	Top of hill above Church (approaching from A120)	Very nice teashop run by a cyclist. Home baked scones and cakes, etc. Nice to sit outside too, nice architecture of the surrounding houses. Just beware the wasps. Don't start chatting to the owner, you'll never get out. Closed Mondays and Thursdays in the Summer. Open in Winter months Friday to Sunday.
Finchingfield Jemima's,	Right on the Green.	Another nice traditional teashop which also serves proper meals. Nice scones, but a bit expensive. Finchingfield is very popular with tourists and motorcyclists in summer so it can be very busy; certainly hard to get a seat outside. There is another teashop up on the hill overlooking the bridge but I haven't investigated this one.
Hare Street	South end of Hare St	Nice teashop. Don't think I've had scones here actually, a shocking oversight. I recommend the omelette with baked potato. Can sit outside in summer. Service is slow though. Not open midweek except in school holidays.
Norton Heath	On old road at crossroads	Bit of a transport café rather than a teashop. Mugs of tea for 40p can't be faulted though. Stink of cigarettes and grease can be! Not open Sundays. Theoretically you can also use the café on the site of the equestrian centre opposite too.
High Easter	Next to Lodges Coaches garage	After several incarnations this is now just a café as opposed to a shop with a table for teas. Poor for cakes, but highly recommended by certain elements in the club for its bacon baguettes and bottomless teapot. Not open Sundays.
Inn on the Green, Danbury	Behind green at junction of A414-North Hill	One of my favourites. Nice scones, if rather crumbly. Can sit outside, which is just as well as the woman in charge seems to dislike cyclists, yet her husband likes us.
Stansted Mountfitchet Old Mill,	Bottom of hill coming in from Elsenham	Not been here for a while, but I remember it for serving strange scones containing mixed peel. Nice though. Other food looked nice too. Very annoyingly closes at 2 on Sundays.
Abridge	In the corner	Only been here once. Not a favourite but preferable to the grease ridden Log Cabin round the corner. Not open Sundays
Silver Ball	Reed	I can only pass on other people's recommendations here as my legs won't take me this far.
